## **Basic Checklist - Going to the Gun Range**



	Prior to heading to the range check the Trail Wildlife Association web page calendar at <a href="https://www.trailwildlife.com">www.trailwildlife.com</a> to ensure that the range you plan on using is available.
	Bring your key to open the main entrance gate, your TWA membership card or affiliated club membership and Firearms License.
	Firearms, gun cases, shooting gloves and ammunition.
	Eye and ear protection, have readily available as you will need it when entering the range area.
	Shooting bags or stands. There are a few sand bags that are kept on the benches at the range. Please leave them there.
	Targets (paper or cardboard), thumb tacks, or staples and stapler.
	Pen to record target information, felt pen to mark shots on targets and masking tape to cover bullet holes.
	Spotting scope or binoculars and include lens cleaners.
	Chronograph to record bullet muzzle velocities.
	Gun cleaning kit with cleaning rod.
	Gunsmith tools for making adjustments on firearms or scopes.
	Wear and bring appropriate clothing as weather conditions can change during a shooting session. Use the layer system.
	Bring your own bottled water or non-alcoholic drinks; potable water is not available at the range.
When you get to the range	
	Sign in and read and follow all the posted rules. If other people are using the range check in with the range officer to make sure you understand the rules about when you can put up or remove targets, approach the firing line, when you can handle weapons, when you can load weapons, when you can shoot, and when you must ceasefire.
